AWARDS ASSEMBLY

Don't forget that our End of Year Awards Assembly will be held on Tuesday 15th December 2020 at 9:30am:

- All attendees including students, staff, visitors, parents and carers must be well and free of any flu-like symptoms.
- All attendees must comply with the 4 square metre rule and keep a distance of 1.5 metre between non-household members.
- All visitors must sign the visitor's book and the external visitor's form. These will be at the assembly area.
 The school is required to maintain a record of names and contact details for all attendees including school staff and visitors for at least 28 days after the event. This record is only used for the purposes of contact tracing for COVID-19 infections and will be stored confidentially and securely.
- We will also create and maintain a record of the seating plan to support contact tracing. All visitors are to remain seated, in the same seat, at all times. Seating will be set out at appropriate distances and must not be moved.
- Hand sanitiser will be available at all entry and exit points. Please ensure you use it on both entry and exit to the school.
- Visitors will need to enter the school through the front gate and walk around the left side of the front office to access the assembly area.
- The girls, boys and disabled toilets in C Block will be the only toilets available to visitors on the day. There is no access to the office or staff toilets. Please inform staff if there is no soap or paper towel.
- Visitors are not allowed access to areas outside of designated areas and must leave promptly at the conclusion of the assembly.
- Tea, coffee and biscuits will be available in the morning. Please do not serve yourself. A designated staff member will take your order and serve you.

At the time of printing this newsletter, it isn't looking great for the quantity of rainfall predicted for Sunday, Monday and Tuesday. We are actually quite concerned if school will even be accessible on Monday due to floodwaters over the road. 




JINGI WALLA AUNTY DELTA KAY

Last week, we had the honour of welcoming Aunty Delta Kay to our school to help us write an "Acknowledgement of Country" that reflects our community surroundings and school values. Aunty Delta is an Arakwal custodian and is committed to working in genuine partnerships with our local communities to promote an awareness, understanding and mutual respect between Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal people. The students brainstormed a range of ideas that were important to them and that they would like to see reflected in our schools very own "Acknowledgement of Country". Aunty Delta and the students identified native flora and fauna that exist in our school setting. They discussed our school values and how they are reflective of being caring and respectful learners, supporting our understanding of Aboriginal people past and present. This incursion offered a fantastic opportunity for the students to reflect on their past experiences and understanding of Indigenous culture whilst gaining a greater appreciation of the importance of the land and past stories that encompass our local area. DOCTOR PLATYPUS

The students enjoyed a visit from Dr. Gilad Bino who works for the University of NSW studying platypus habitats in NSW. His expertise assisted students in their understanding of threatened and endangered species in Australia. The students went down to the creek, where they identified habitat changes in the area that have affected platypus populations. Unfortunately, there have been no known sightings of platypus in our creek for a very long time. Dr. Bino discussed how pollution and chemicals used for spraying crops have also had a detrimental effect on the rivers, not just for platypus but a range of species that depend on healthy water ways. Back in the classroom, they looked at some videos and pictures of Dr. Bino and his team of scientists on location in various parts of NSW. This offered an opportunity for the students to ask questions about what it is like studying endangered and threatened species and some of the challenges encountered on their field trips. Thank you Dr. Bino for assisting the students with their understanding of the importance of sustainability in our community and ways to reduce our environmental footprint, ensuring a healthy environment for future generations.
